Construction Meeting was held on February 4th and shortly thereafter permit paperwork was submitted to the Putnam County. While the permits have yet to be issued, Blackwater Construction, our Architect, the County and Library representatives met on March 24th and selected exterior brick colors, exterior and interior paint colors, flooring and countertop laminate colors. We will

continue to meet monthly to review progress and anxiously await the award of permits and the start of construction. We deeply appreciate the support of Putnam County and our community as this important project moves forward!

AN AWARD FOR THE MELROSE LIBRARY ASSOCIATION!

Every year the Florida Library Association (FLA) gives out awards to Friends Groups, Foundations and Boards. The Melrose Library Association is considered a Friends Group. One of the awards is the Friends Newsletter Award. This award is given for a newsletter produced by Friends, demonstrating a high quality of writing, as well as promoting libraries, library programs and the Friends group. The newsletter must truly be a Friends' newsletter, as

opposed to a publication written and produced by library staff. Documentation required for the award includes samples of four most recent newsletters and a narrative describing the purpose and intended audience, planning, creation and personnel involved as well as method of distribution and recipients. Criteria included purpose and intended audience, method of creation and personnel involved, effective promotion of Friends and library, appearance (layout, graphic design, formatting), appeal of content & quality of writing content. This year, the Melrose Library Association's newsletter (this publication) was awarded the Friends' Newsletter Award!
