Library Expansion and Renovation Update

In past newsletters, our updates included information regarding the grant proposal for funding the expansion and renovation of our library. In January 2018 the Florida Legislature, when working up the new budget, decided not to fund grants for the second consecutive year. Therefore, no money was awarded to Melrose or any other Florida libraries that submitted grant paperwork. In response, Putnam County will be submitting the proper paperwork to roll over our current application for consideration next year. The MLA will conduct another legislative outreach effort later in the year in hopes of influencing our Representatives and Senators to positively

support our library.

The MLA plans to begin renovations to our existing library this year using funds that have been raised to this point within the community. The MLA applied for a grant from the Clay Electric Cooperative Foundation program to install handicapped accessible switches on the front door and bathroom doors at the library. We hope to hear positive news regarding this grant in the next month. This will be helpful not only to those with limited mobility, but also to others with their hands full when approaching the library door. Please look for these improvements and continue to support our efforts to renovate and expand your library.

Author James Williams to speak at the Melrose Library



On August 23rd, at 2 p.m. come to the library to hear James Williams speak on the topic of Bellamy Road. Mr. Williams is a Hampton native, Gainesville resident, former Editor of the Lake Ridge Monitor and a member of the Keystone Heights Rotary Club. His second book, *Four Florida Roads*, will be published this fall. The four roads include the Pensacola-St. Augustine Trial, half of which is also popularly known as Bellamy Road. Rounding out the set are the Tamiami Trail, U.S. 301 (especially in Bradford

County) and Interstate 95. The book also notes native and Spanish trails, and roads of tomorrow. *Four Florida Roads* is a narrative of the planning and construction of four roads which taken together, form a highly individualistic history of our state. Commemorative Bricks at the Library

When walking along the sidewalk at the library, or entering the Butterfly Garden you may notice bricks lining those areas. The MLA has an ongoing commemorative brick project.
