

Pro Tip: If you're listening to audiobooks on your smart phone, I recommend downloading Libby from OverDrive as opposed to the classic OverDrive app. It's all the same platform but Libby just works better on smartphones - especially for audiobooks.

We also have **Biblioboard Library** where you can discover local content from self-published Florida authors. All content in Biblioboard Library is available with unlimited access. Never experience a hold, late fee, checkout limit, or lending limit. Just visit https://library.biblioboard.com/home or download the Biblioboard Library app on your smart device. No need to log in with your library card if you're in Putnam County and have geolocation enabled on your device. Plus, with **Pressbooks** and the **Indie Author Project**, it's easier than ever for local authors to make their independently- or self-published books available to their community through their local libraries. And it's all free!
