
Private Camellia Garden Day


Ron Haase to speak at the Melrose Library February 22 at 2 p.m.

Professor Emeritus, Ron Haase taught architecture for 20 years at UF. He has degrees in architecture from U. Minnesota and a civil engineering degree from U. Wisconsin. He travels and lectures extensively about vernacular architecture. His new book, *Last House*, tells the story of a Florida couple who built 4 beautiful homes over the course of their married life. The first house was built along Cross Creek and the second on Siesta Key in the Sarasota area. The third on Biscayne Bay and their last house a beachside retirement home in Summer Haven near St.

Augustine. Those who have worked with architects to create their own homes will identify, but anyone who loves architecture will enjoy the ride, as well. In his new book he brings along the ghosts of Marjorie Rawlings, Paul Rudolph, Leonard Horowitz and Albert Manucy to help make the argument for respect for architectural context and vernacular roots. The MLA Al Burt Festival welcomes author, Bob Lee

Bob Lee, author of *Bad Guys, Bullets, and Boat Chases: True Stories of Florida Game Wardens,* will speak on March 24 at 2 p.m. at the library. Mr. Lee is a former lieutenant and 30-year veteran of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, where he caught hundreds of poachers throughout his career. As part of the author's book talk, he will interview retired wildlife supervisor, Gray Leonhard. He is the key character in the story of Flight 401, the first chapter of Mr. Lee's new book. On December 29, 1972, Leonhard was a two-month rookie, on solo night patrol, when he witnessed Flight 401 crash into the Everglades. At the time, it was



the first wide body jet to crash and the worst aviation disaster in U.S. history. Please come out and enjoy Mr. Lee and Mr. Leonhard as they discuss the book. Refreshments will follow the discussion.
