LIBRARY EXPANSION AND RENOVATION UPDATE

The library expansion and renovation planning process continues to move forward in a positive manner. The Pre-Bid Meeting was held on October 9th ; Bid Proposal submissions were submitted October 21st; the County Intent to Award occurred on October 26th; and the Bid Award was accepted and approved by the Putnam County Board of County Commissioners on November 10th. Blackwater Construction was awarded the bid. Next steps are contract signing, supplemental information submission and the preconstruction meeting...then we break ground! As the 2021 school year began in August of 2020, the Melrose Library Association continued its support of our community by promoting the Pony Pack program, which provides backpacks, enjoyable books, and weekend meals for designated students. This year's program currently caters to 32 students in grades K through 6.

Pony Pack is successful due to the help of several local philanthropists. The Clay Electric Foundation, commonly referred to as Operation Round Up, awarded a grant of \$5000 to purchase books and materials for the students, and the children of Ann and Phil Payne awarded \$500 to the MLA to purchase backpacks for the children. Additionally, Trinity Episcopal Church provides the weekend meals through various donations. Individual members of the MLA made other donations of books and backpacks, which is further proof of the giving nature of the Melrose community.
